he British Metals Recycling Association (BMRA) is the trade association representing the £7 billion UK metal recycling sector.

The **BMRA** keeps members informed about upcoming issues and regulations, while helping them overcome problems and challenges related to running a metal recycling business.

The **BMRA** represents organisations that trade and process over 10 million tonnes of ferrous and non-ferrous

metals every year, including: steel, aluminium and copper. It is made up of businesses of all sizes, including small family owned businesses and large international companies.

Member activities include collecting, sorting, shearing, baling, shredding, media separation, as well as re-use, casting, and fabrication. Members recycle a wide range of products, such as end-of-life vehicles, packaging, batteries, domestic appliances, building materials and electronic goods.

We also have close working relationships with the European Recycling Industries Confederation (EuRIC) and the Bureau of International Recycling (BIR), to ensure members' interests are represented on the European and international stage. This is extremely important when you consider that 80% of scrap metal is exported from the UK, supporting the majority of the UK supply chain.





Technical, regulatory and business support and updates

The **BMRA** can give members advice on technical, regulatory and environmental issues, including the Scrap Metals Dealers Act 2013, Air Weapons and Licensing (Scotland) Act 2015, Fire Preventions Plans, metal theft, permit compliance, paperwork, and much more.

Members can access an employment and business telephone helpline for free advice on issues such as tax, VAT, PAYE, payroll, employment and HR matters.

Via **BMRA** bulletins, printed magazine *Scrapbook*, and various training seminars, members can keep up-to-date with all manner of issues that may affect their business. There is also a host of information on the members' only area of the **BMRA** website.

Lobbying Government:

BMRA continues to lobby for more favourable policies for the metal recycling industry, with a view to securing greater government recognition of the industry's contribution to the circular economy and net zero ambitions.

BMRA continues to lobby and raise awareness about the dangers of fires at scrap metal and waste sites, caused by flammable/ combustible material,

particularly lithium/lithium-ion batteries. In addition, **BMRA** is working to develop sector-specific Fire Prevention Plan (FPP) guidance to help guide companies through the FPP process.

Waste classifications:

The sector continues to face many challenges as an increasing number of wastes come under scrutiny. **BMRA** continues to work on the waste classification and POPs status of these wastes and seeks to ensure they can continue to be treated appropriately and recycled wherever possible.

Net Zero:

We will continue to curate a range of materials to ensure members are in the most informed position possible to reduce their business'

carbon emissions.
